Senate Bill 719 – Student Organizations/Rights & Recognition (originally introduced in 2013)

- Status: Passed by both houses and presented to the Governor on 6/20/14.
- Summary: Allows student organizations at constituent institutions and community colleges to determine their organizations' core functions and resolve any disputes of the organization. Prohibits constituent institutions and community colleges from denying recognition to organizations for exercising these rights.
