July 28, 2014 Week-in-Review



- **0 new** public education-related bills were filed this week. **0** were initiated in the House; **0** was filed in the Senate.
- 0 House joint resolutions filed.

Of note:

Senate Bill 744, Appropriations Act of 2014 (the 2014-15 budget) was ratified on 8/2/14. It now goes to the Governor.

Originally filed on 7/16/14, <u>Senate Bill 884, 2014 Appointments Bill</u>. The resignation of two members of the North Carolina Charter Schools Advisory Board prompted the addition of two appointees to the President Pro Tempore's recommendations. **The bill passed a third reading in the House on 8/2/14.**

- Sherry T. Reeves of Pamlico County is appointed to the North Carolina Charter Schools Advisory Board for a term expiring on June 30, 2015, to fill the unexpired term of Baker A. Mitchell.
- Phyllis P. Gibbs of Guilford County is appointed to the North Carolina Charter Schools Advisory Board for a term expiring on June 30, 2017, to fill the unexpired term of Paul Norcross.
