


North Carolina's Voucher-Accepting Private Schools 2024-25

In 2024-25, North Carolina has 892 registered private schools. Of those schools, 667 are *direct payment schools*, which means they are *eligible to receive voucher funds from the state*. The

remaining 225 (25%) do not accept vouchers. Rural counties are being forced to subsidize private schools in urban/suburban counties. View an interactive map of the number of direct payment (voucher-accepting) schools by county <u>here</u>.
